The National Aquarium is committed to welcoming all guests to experience our aquatic world. To ensure that your visit is safe and enjoyable, we've made some changes that may impact guests with disabilities:

One-Way Path

To help ensure social distancing, all guests will be asked to adhere to our new, one-way flow through Piers 3 and 4. We'll help you navigate along the way—just follow the fish!

The elevators shown on all floor plans in this existing guide are still available. Please ride safely, with one family or party at a time.

Before you begin your Aquarium journey, please consider visiting the Family/Guest Relations Room on Pier 3, Level 1. Once you start along the one-way path, this location will only be reachable via elevator.

Upon exiting Elevator A on Level 5 to enter the *Upland Tropical Rain Forest*, you will be moving against the flow of traffic. The path is narrow, with some inclines. Make your way to the beginning of the exhibit at the top of the escalator and retrace your route to safely enter the flow of guest traffic into the exhibit area.

Wheelchair pickup is available at the new stroller self-parking area on the ground level of Pier 3.

Some sensory elements in the galleries—including *Living Seashore* and the *Children's Discovery Gallery*—will be temporarily unavailable.

Reentry into the Aquarium is not allowed.
